Bears Break Records

On Tuesday, March 26, LR hosted its seventh annual giving day, Bears Give Back, and set a new record for total dollars raised in 24 hours. **785 generous alumni, family, friends and students** contributed **\$847,320** in support of academics and experiences that make LR special. These funds will provide immediate and direct support to students in the form of scholarships, innovative curriculum and instruction, study abroad opportunities, access to events around the United States, athletic programs and other elements of a multi-faceted liberal arts education.

Students celebrated and thanked donors all day long at our campus wide gathering, learning about the impact of philanthropy on their student experience. LR Education in Action

The Little Read program embodies the spirit of a liberal arts education by bringing together multiple disciplines. It centers around a nationally recognized children's author who comes to LR for a spring residency. This year, we celebrated record attendance for the giant puppet theater performance based on children's illustrator Michaela Goade's award-winning book "We Are Water Protectors."

Faculty from Lenoir-Rhyne's School of Education join forces with elementary teachers to craft a multi-disciplinary curriculum based on the selected book. This curriculum weaves together elements of literature, science, social studies, and the arts, offering a well-rounded exploration of the chosen theme.

The LR Playmakers, a student theater group, bring the book to life with a captivating play adapted from the story. This artistic expression not only entertains but also deepens understanding of the characters and themes.

The program's impact extends beyond the classroom. Through the generosity of donors to The Little Read program, LR provides free copies of the selected book to students in collaboration with Hickory City, Catawba County and Alexander County schools. For some, this may be their first or only personal book, a precious gift that ignites a passion for reading.

Hands-on Exploration and Discovery

Through the generosity of alumni and local businesses, the Alex Lee Career and Professional Development Center at Lenoir-Rhyne hosts etiquette dinners for students interested in learning how to best conduct themselves during professional dining situations, like interviews or business outings.



Developing the Whole Person

Three hundred and twenty-five student athletes earned a spot on the 2023-2024 South Atlantic Conference (SAC) Commissioner's Honor Roll, with at least one student athlete coming from each of LR's 23 sports. To be eligible, the student athlete must maintain a GPA of 3.30 or higher throughout the year.

Additionally, LR student athletes ranked ninth nationally among Division II schools by totaling **7,514 total hours of community service**. This marks the fourth straight year where LR has marked in the top 15 among DII institutions, and the ninth-place finish is tied for the best finish in LR history.

"I am extremely proud of our Bears student athletes for how they prioritize the importance of serving and giving back to our community," Vice President for Athletics Kim Pate said. "They truly embody everything we'd want in a student athlete; they are excelling in their sport, in the classroom, and are making an impact in the community."
